



had seen his uncertainty. I responded "it all depends upon which way you lean." Yesterday, I felt like that rookie. I was several miles into a ride, indeed, several scenic miles, as I was riding along the Mississippi toward the Moline bridge. I thought I would pull over to take a picture. I realized that my left cleat would not unclip. I have to admit, the left cleat and pedal have not been happy partners for a few years. I have had to force that foot and shoe off to the side to unclip for some time. I always unclip the left cleat and then "land" that way. I have been concerned about that side for some time, even bringing other cleats from my parish to see if that would help. Nope, it was still hard to clip and unclip. So, this has continued to be cause for concern.

Mons Soseman Yesterday, though, the battle between cleat and pedal had come to a head. No matter what I did, I could not manage to unclip that pedal. I had benefitted from a strong tailwind coming down the river. I did not want to be handicapped on the way back. So, I used a convenient turn around, and rather than snapping that picture, I headed toward home. The wind was ferocious, but the pedal problem kept me from thinking about that. I finally came to a moment of decision. I reached a spot where there was a detour and a sharp incline back onto the normal bike lane. I, of course, could make it, but I was nervous as there was a family with four cycles and a dog (a cute little dog in a backpack), two dog walkers, and various other hazards (trust yourself, don't trust anyone else was a driving tip I learned in Italy). Rather than tipping over on the hill, I pedaled along a deserted street until I could come to a place where I might stop. Concentrating on removing the right cleat from the pedal and leaning that way, I managed to stop safely, left foot still in the left cleat, which was still attached to that left pedal. Inspired by the few pictures I have seen of triathlon, undid the straps on the left foot, and managed to get my foot out of the shoe. I realized that, like a competitor in a triathlon, transitioning from swimming to cycling, I could shove my foot back into the left cleat if I needed. This is what happened. No matter what I did, I could not uncouple left cleat from left pedal. In fact, in my attempt, I managed to twist the shoe completely around, two or three times, and it still would not come off. I reached in the saddlebag for the multitool, and realized that I had left that multitool in the saddlebag of the bike I left in Italy. Alas.

Instead, I was distracted by the pedal situation, and pushed on, barely even thinking about the wind. I don't know if that is more testament to the situation, or to the fact that I have been riding so often this Summer I have gotten used to these aggravations again, wind, hills, annoying muscle cramps, heavy breathing. I am not the only one contending with heavy breathing today, as our brave cyclists labor on up hill and down dale. Not much, though, on this "flat" stage. Still more than I want to contend with on a daily jaunt.
